Course Syllabus English Class – Kindergarten

Year: 2016 – 2017

Credits: 1hour and thirty minutes/week

Course Description

The main goal of the English kindergarten course is to provide the students a foundation for effective communication with the target language. This course is geared towards the development of basic English vocabulary related to everyday life situations and student's immediate reality. Oral communication skills as well as pre-reading skills will be developed through story-telling, reading aloud, picture games, props, finger play, and songs.

General Course objective

The kindergarten course will provide a variety of activities to enable students to achieve the English standards which include the following:

- Mastery of basic skills such as; listening, speaking, and reading readiness
- Acquire and use vocabulary that enables the students to communicate orally in everyday life situations.
- Develop pleasure towards reading by listening to stories read by the teacher
- Follow oral instructions
- Answer questions using short phrases and complete simple sentences
- Discriminate beginning sounds and letters in words
- Develop pleasure for music and English songs
- Develop reading readiness skills
