Course description

The Sixth grade English course is geared towards developing appreciation for the English language. The main goal of this course is to prepare students to communicate in English as a second language in both oral and written form. It emphasizes in the four basic skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing through the use of thematic units. The course intends to develop reading, writing, and oral communication of the language through a variety of experiences such as oral reports, investigations, journals, and creative writing related to the thematic units chosen. The course also intends to integrate the Principals of a Learning Community into the themes chosen by the students and provide adapted material for students with special needs and their learning capacities within their grade level. Both students with special needs and the exceptional children will be individually provided accommodations according to the Federal legislation of the No Child Left Behind Act 108-466 of 2004 and the "Legislación Estatal 51 "Ley de Servicios Educativos Integrales para Personas con Impedimentos" of 1996. They will also benefit of the Individual with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (public law 108-446 of 2004.) Different strategies will be used that will enable these students to learn English as a Second Language at their own pace and abilities. Accommodations will be provided to the exceptional child and the Special Education students taking into consideration the specifications of their PEI provided by the Special Education Teacher. The skills will be developed for both groups at their own capacities and levels.
